

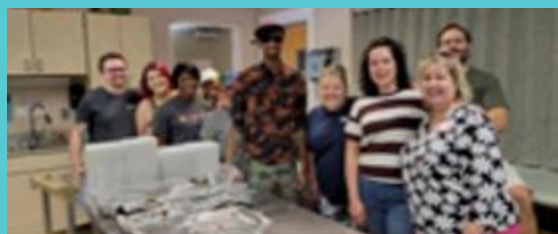

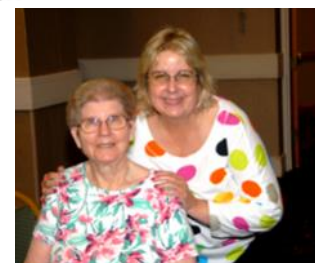

I was so proud as a Past President of the North Carolina JCI Senate to witness the turnout for the Mid-Year Convention in Greensboro last weekend. Our NC Jaycees are growing and the NC Senate continues to support them.

I am serving again this year as the Region IV Representative for the US JCI Senate Foundation. Senators in North Carolina contribute to the Foundation and submit state high school seniors each year for national scholarships. Last year, Carly Phillips won a \$1,500 scholarship to attend the University of North Carolina. At the national level, forty five \$1,500 academic and five \$1,000 vocational scholarships are available. North Carolina may submit two academic and one vocational graduate to be considered for these scholarships.

Great opportunities do not come along very often, but at the US JCI Senate National Convention in June, newly elected US President Hal Williams #43912 introduced **WHEELCHAIRS 4 KIDS** Special Project!

President Hal has served as President of Wheelchairs 4 Kids for several years and has seen the positive impact it has had on 1300 children with disabilities in 44 states, including 49 kids in North Carolina!

WHEELCHAIRS 4 KIDS is a non-profit 501 (c) 3 organization dedicated to improving the lives of children with disabilities by providing wheelchairs, home and vehicle modifications and other assistive equipment at no charge to the families through their "Let's Roll Program." They also provide fun activities designed especially for these special children through the "Wheely Fun Days." Activities include water skiing, snow skiing & indoor sky diving (using special equipment), visiting the aquarium, ball games, WWE events, Wheely Fun Christmas with Santa and many more.

Founded in 2011 by Madeline Robinson and her husband, Lonnie, who are both JCI Senators, they realized there was a need for many children with physical disabilities who were in wheelchairs that needed repair (some held together by duct tape), were too small, unsafe, uncomfortable and if not replaced, could cause other health issues such as respiratory problems, scoliosis, and pressure sores. Not only are they providing mobility for these kids, but they are also helping them to gain the independence they need and deserve.

Thanks to US Senate President Hal, we can assist the Robinsons in helping these wonderful children live a much better life by joining the Guardians of the Wheel Kids Club. All it takes is to sign up to make a monthly donation that funds the "Let's Roll" equipment program and "Wheely Fun Days" inclusion program. As a "Guardian", you will receive a wall calendar showcasing the Wheel Kids and an enamel pin so that you can show everyone that you're a supporter of Wheelchairs 4 Kids. The attached flyer contains a QR code to the "Guardian" program.

It is my pleasure to serve as the NC chairperson for Wheelchairs 4 Kids this year! For the last six years Bill and I have had the opportunity to participate in many fundraising and special events for Wheelchairs 4 Kids.
