It's already April!! The 2023-24 Year is just flying by with lots of fun and excitement. Lots has been happening in the past few months. 2024 started off with the US JCI Senate Winter Boards in Greenville, SC (yes – "THAT" Greenville). Being so close, the turn-out of NC Senators was amazing with over 60 of us attending and assisting the South Carolina and supporting our larger family of Region IV. 

One of my friends called me back and gave me instruction and the encouragement I needed for changing my flat.



I said yes I do and that I had a flat tire. She calls her husband over to help me. The husband changes my flat tire and puts on the spare. He explains what he's doing and shows me how to do it the whole time. The wife is so nice and is talking to me while her husband changes my tire. When they were done I checked my purse & car but I had no cash to give them to say thank you. When I told them that I didn't have any cash to give them for their help, they both said that they wouldn't have accepted it. They were just happy to help me. I asked if I could give them a hug and both accepted. I wish I had gotten their names but I didn't. They made sure I was good to drive off before they left. I made it home safely hours later.

I realized then that God was watching over me and put me in a place to receive his help. The gas station was close by when I needed it, he put that wonderful couple there to help me, and he made it a teachable moment for me to learn a lesson. I now keep some cash in my car in case of an emergency. I know what to do to change my tire if needed. I also realized that I had to want the help and accept it. How does the person give a Sponsorship? **The Sponsorships are monetary and the sponsor can specify where the donation will go or it can be unrestricted and go into the general operating budget of the NC JCI Senate.**

Does this program take away from giving to other programs that Senators have traditionally given to? **No this is program is designed to promote giving to the Senate and to have formal recognition for ALL of the giving that occurs throughout the year not just for one specific project.**

How are Sponsorships recognized? **The Sponsor can choose to be completely anonymous or decide how they will be recognized on signage, website, newsletter and/or social Media for the appropriate sponsorship level.**

Who keeps track of the Sponsorships? **There are multiple people involved in tracking Sponsorships these include the Sponsorship Chair, Project Chair and Treasurer**

Is there an accounting of each Sponsorship given? **Yes – There is an accounting of each Sponsorship that is given**

Is this a charitable donation? **The NC JCI Senate is a 501c4 – Not For Profit Organization. A letter documenting the Sponsorship Level can be requested which will outline the amount of the Sponsorship on our letterhead. It will be up to the donor to determine if and how the amount of the Sponsorship can be used regarding tax purposes.**
